Introduction

- Lesson text: Jn. 3:19-21
- 1. All month long we are examining the theme of "Clear Christianity."
- 2. Tonight, we will examine the closely related concept of being transparent.

I. Transparent Defined

- 1. The English word "transparent" only occurs once in the Bible (Rev. 21:21).
 - a. transparent (*diauges* G1307 adjective) "possessing the property of being able to be seen through, transparent, pure" (BDAG 238).
- 2. Transparent is defined as (Merriam-Webster's Collegiate Dictionary):
 - a. "having the property of transmitting light without appreciable scattering so that bodies lying beyond are seen clearly."
 - b. "fine or sheer enough to be seen through."
 - c. "free from pretense or deceit: frank."
 - d. "easily detected or seen through: obvious."
 - e. "readily understood."
 - f. "characterized by visibility or accessibility of information especially concerning business practices synonym see clear."
- 3. Connected with the concept of transparent is:
 - a. Honesty, being genuine, or sincere (<u>Jn. 1:45-47</u>).
 - b. Purity.
 - c. Truth.
 - d. Light.
 - e. Clarity.

II. Being Transparent Means Coming to the Light

- 1. Jesus made this point clear with Nicodemus (Jn. 3:19-21).
 - a. The light of God's Word must be able to shine through us.
 - b. We cannot be transparent if we hide in the dark.
 - c. We can never hide from God anyway, so why try (Ps. 139:1-16)?
 - d. Being transparent means we can echo the words of David (Ps. 139:23-24).
- 2. God's Word is the mirror of the soul (Jm. 1:21-25).

- a. The law of liberty because it is perfect [complete; whole] is able to perfect us if we will allow it to (Jm. 1:25; cf. 2 Tim. 3:16-17)!
- 3. God's Word renews the mind (Rm. 12:1-2).
 - a. renewing (*anakainosis* G342 noun) "a renewal, renovation, complete change for the better" (Thayer 38).
 - b. Though our outward man perishes, our inward man is renewed day by day (2 Cor. 4:16-18).

III. Being Transparent Means We Need Each Other

- 1. We need each other to speak truth (Eph. 4:25).
- 2. We need each other to love one another (1 Pt. 1:22).
 - a. unfeigned (*anypokritos* G505 adjective) means without hypocrisy [undisguised] and thus genuine or sincere.
- 3. We need each other to exhort one another daily (Heb. 3:12-13).
 - a. exhort (*parakaleo* G3870 verb, present, imperative) included in this word is admonishment, comfort, instruction, encouragement, and strengthening.
- 4. We need each other to provoke unto love and good works (Heb. 10:24-25).
 - a. provoke (*paroxysmos* G3948 noun) the idea is to agitate, irritate, or incite one another in a good way.
- 5. We need each other to confess our faults to one another and pray for one another (Jm. 5:16).
 - a. Being at odds with a brother or sister in Christ directly affects our worship (Mt. 5:23-24).
 - b. Praying for one another was common in the First Century and must be now (Ac. 12:5; cf. Rm. 15:30-31).
- 6. We need each other to restore the overtaken and to bear one another's burdens (Gal. 6:1-2; Jm. 5:19-20).
- 7. We need each other to do good to one another (Gal. 6:10).

Conclusion

- 1. We can all improve when it comes to being transparent.
- 2. Let us resolve right now to be more honest and truthful and to allow God's Word to refine us to be better.
