Introduction

- 1. Does the church do good to everyone?
- 2. Doing good is the idea of benevolence.
 - a. Benevolence is defined as "disposition to do good" or "an act of kindness" (Merriam-Webster's collegiate dictionary).
- 3. It is good to be zealous in a good thing always (Gal. 4:18).
 - a. We must be committed to the church in the area of benevolence.
 - b. It is never wrong to do good and so we must make sure we are doing good.
 - c. Who defines good? God does (Ps. 25:8; cf. Ps. 86:5; Lk. 18:19)!
 - d. What defines what is good? God's Holy Word (2 Tim. 3:16-17)!
 - e. Therefore, I can go to God's Word, learn from it, and know exactly what good is and then practice it.

I. The Gist of the Old Law

- 1. A lawyer could not keep his mouth shut (Mt. 22:34-36).
- 2. The first and great commandment (Mt. 22:37-38).
 - a. The first and foremost duty under the Old Law was to completely love God.
 - b. Under the New Testament this principle has not changed (Mt. 6:33).
- 3. The second commandment is similar (Mt. 22:39).
 - a. The next duty under the Old Law was to love their neighbor as themselves.
 - b. Under the New Testament we have the golden rule (Mt. 7:12).
- 4. This is what it is all about (Mt. 22:40).

II. Who is My Neighbor?

- 1. Another lawyer tested Jesus (<u>Lk. 10:25</u>).
 - a. Jesus pointed him to the Scriptures (Lk. 10:26).
 - b. His reply was a good one (<u>Lk. 10:27-28</u>).
 - c. The lawyer wanted to justify himself and asked another question (<u>Lk.</u> <u>10:29</u>).

- 2. The parable of the good Samaritan (Lk. 10:30-37).
 - a. We conclude that our neighbor is the one we have the **opportunity** and **ability** to help (<u>Lk. 10:33-36</u>).
 - b. We must do likewise (Lk. 10:37).

III. Doing the Most Good

- 1. The church is God's workmanship created in Christ Jesus for good works (Eph. 2:10).
- 2. The church does the most good because her Head did the same (Ac. 10:38; Eph. 1:20-23).
 - a. Tabitha understood this (Ac. 9:36-39).
 - b. Pure and undefiled religion defined (Jm. 1:27).
- 3. The church does the most good by being eager to help the needy (<u>Gal.</u> 2:10).
 - a. Be a sheep (Mt. 25:33-40).
- 4. The church does the most good by loving her enemies (Rm. 12:19-21).
 - a. This is contrary to how many think but necessary nonetheless (Mt. 5:43-48)!
- 5. The church does the most good by standing on the truth and teaching it (Rm. 10:13-17).
 - a. God wanted His Law heard by all so that they may fear and obey Him (Dt. 31:12-13).
 - b. We speak the truth in love (Eph. 4:15).

Conclusion

- 1. The church is a benevolent organization.
- 2. The greatest good we can do for anyone is to teach them the gospel of Jesus Christ.
 - a. A soul is worth more than all the world (Mt. 16:26).
 - b. Let us be sure as we help with physical needs that we do not neglect the greater spiritual needs!
- 3. Be committed to the church in doing good.
