Introduction

- 1. The frequency of our thanksgiving must be always (Eph. 5:20).
- 2. It seems straightforward to be thankful when things are going well but we must also be thankful when they are not.

I. One Out of Ten (<u>Lk. 17:11-19</u>)

- 1. Leprosy is a horrible disease.
 - a. When Miriam became leprous Aaron described her "as one dead, of whom the flesh is half consumed when he cometh out of his mother's womb" (Num. 12:12).
- 2. It was not uncommon to meet groups of lepers as one entered a village (<u>Lk.</u> <u>17:12</u>).
 - a. By the Law of Moses lepers were required to be separated from the rest of the people (cf. <u>Lev. 13:45-46</u>).
- 3. The lepers got Jesus' attention (Lk. 17:13).
- 4. Jesus commanded the lepers to go show themselves to the priests (<u>Lk.</u> <u>17:14</u>).
 - a. This was necessary in order for them to be declared clean (cf. Lev. 14).
- 5. Only one out of the ten previous lepers thanked God for the miracle which had occurred (<u>Lk. 17:15-16</u>).
- 6. Where are the nine (<u>Lk. 17:17-18</u>)?
 - a. Here was an opportunity to show gratitude for what Christ had done yet only ten percent did.
 - b. We were dead in sin until Christ healed us (2 Cor. 5:14-17; Gal. 3:26-27; Eph. 2:1).

II. Thankful in Tribulation

- 1. Tribulation will come our way guaranteed (2 Tim. 3:12; Ac. 14:22).
 - a. It happened to Jesus (Jn. 15:19-20; cf. Isa. 52:13-53:12).
 - b. It happened to His apostles (Ac. 12:1-5).
 - c. It happened to the church (Ac. 8:1-3).
- 2. When the going gets tough the tough keep going (Gal. 6:9; 2 Th. 3:13).
 - a. No complaining (Php. 2:14).

- b. No walking away from Christ (Jn. 6:66).
- c. We press on (Php. 3:14).
- 3. We must stay a thankful people during tribulation.
 - a. Consider Paul and Silas (Ac. 16:16-25).
 - b. Paul wrote Ephesians in a Roman prison (Eph. 6:18-20; cf. Eph. 3:1, 4:1).

III. Proper Perspective

- 1. We can be thankful at all times as long as we have the proper perspective (2 Cor. 4).
 - a. This life is temporary and so too are the difficulties we go through in it ($\underline{2}$ Cor. 4:16-17).
 - b. Eternity is forever (2 Cor. 4:18).
- 2. Paul noted difficulties but he saw the silver lining in each of them (2 Cor. 4:8-11).
 - a. The death and life of Christ was made manifest (2 Cor. 4:10-11).
- 3. Thanksgiving abounded to the glory of God (2 Cor. 4:12-15).
- 4. Paul fought a good fight, finished his course, and kept the faith (2 Tim. 4:6-8).
 - a. Thanksgiving at all times helped him to do that and it will help us too!

Conclusion

- 1. We must be a thankful people when the times are good and when the times are not good.
- 2. There is never a time when we should be unthankful to the God of Heaven.
- 3. Whatever we are going through now is temporary but eternity is forever.
