#### Introduction

- 1. "...he went away sorrowful..." (Mt. 19:22).
  - a. This person was sorrowful, but why?

## I. A Lot Going For Him

- 1. He was young (Mt. 19:20).
  - a. There is great vigor in youth (1 Jn. 2:13-14).
  - b. There is great opportunity to serve God in youth (Ecc. 11:9-12:7).
- 2. He was in a position of leadership (Lk. 18:18).
  - a. Perhaps he was even a member of the Jewish council known as the Sanhedrin (BDAG 140).
  - b. There were certainly some of the Sanhedrin who had an interest in speaking to Jesus (Jn. 3:1-21).
- 3. He came to Jesus (Mt. 19:16).
  - a. Jesus was the right person to come to as He is The Way to the Father (<u>Jn.</u> <u>14:1-6</u>; cf. <u>Jn.</u> <u>6:44-45</u>).
- 4. He asked the right question (Mt. 19:16).
  - a. Evidently he believed he had an obligation to *do* something in order to obtain eternal life (cf. Jm. 2:14-26).
- 5. He had been obedient to the commandments thus far (Mt. 19:17-20).
  - a. True love is shown by obedience (<u>Jn. 14:15</u>, <u>21</u>; <u>1 Jn. 5:1-5</u>).

# II. Too Much Holding Him Back

- 1. He did not want to give it all for Christ (Mt. 19:21).
  - a. perfect (*teleios* G5046 adjective) "properly brought to its end, finished; wanting nothing necessary to completeness...of mind and character, one who has reached the proper height of virtue and integrity: Mt. 5:48; 19:21" (Thayer 618).
  - b. This young man had to count the cost just as we must (Lk. 14:26-33).
  - c. Christ must have my all including my possessions.
- 2. His possessions possessed him (Mt. 19:22).
  - a. Riches can be a great hindrance into entering the kingdom of Heaven (Mk. 10:23-25).

- i. for them that trust (*ho* G3588 definite article *peitho* G3982 verb) "to believe in something or someone to the extent of placing reliance or trust in or on" (Louw-Nida 375).
- ii. Here is the issue! Our trust must be completely given to God and then our goods will follow our heart (<u>Pr. 3:5-10</u>).

### III. Left All but Gained More

- 1. The apostles had left all (forsaken Mt. 19:27) and followed Jesus but gained so much more (Mk. 10:28-30).
- 2. It is the epitome of foolishness, the destroyer of happiness, and the height of selfishness to walk away from Christ.
  - a. Yet, the price was too high for this unhappy young man.

### Conclusion

- 1. The rich, young ruler teaches us a valuable lesson on possessions.
  - a. We must be willing to give up whatever stands in our way of following Christ.
  - b. Too often it is material things and if that is the case then they need to be taken care of as Christ told this young man.
- 2. True happiness comes in giving and not hoarding.
  - a. Furthermore, true happiness comes in following Christ wherever His pathway goes!
  - b. We know ultimately it leads to Heaven which is the greatest treasure of all.
